Wuthering Heights by Emily Bronte

Can love transcend heaven and hell and is revenge justified? These are the two central questions that the novel "Wuthering Heights" by Emily Bronte tries to grapple through a story spanning the lives of three generations.

The book starts when an orphan boy named Heathcliff is adopted by Mr. Earnshaw who has two children.

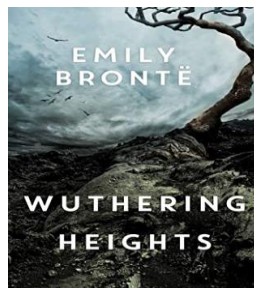
Heathcliff and Catherine Earnshaw instantly befriend each other and live the wild lives of children. However, their childhood comes to an abrupt halt when Catherine first visits the home of the Lintons, a family who is higher in status. Henceforth, she becomes cautious of her appearance and gradually, Heathcliff watches her marry Edgar Linton, the eldest son of Linton family.

Catherine's brother is named Hindley, and due to his vengeful nature because he considers Heathcliff to be the favourite of his dead father, Heathcliff leaves Yorkshire after Catherine's marriage and returns a changed man. The course of the characters' fate is decided by him as he viciously and vengefully exacts revenge from the people who hurt him.

With an element of gothic and romance pervading the entire layers of each character's lives, the novel explores themes of love, loss and the true nature of revenge and its implication. The book delves deep into the consciousness of each character to portray a vivid and yet, terribly cynical and pessimistic perspective of the characters' involved in the novel. Haunting scenes of the Wuthering Heights and the area surrounding the property arouse a sense of mystery and suspense as the readers remain on toes thinking about the upcoming events in the book.

So, the book is a ride into the mind of an unreliable narrator Nelly and the impulsive nature of the story. Overall, no line in the book perfectly describes the novel other Catherine's famous line "He's more myself than I am. Whatever our souls are made of, his and mine are the same".

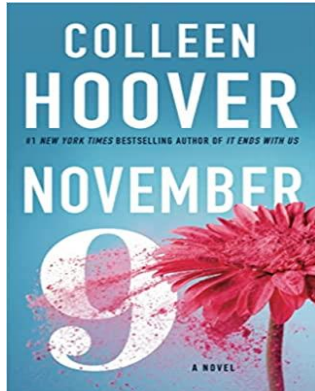

The Time Traveler's Wife by Audrey Niffenegger

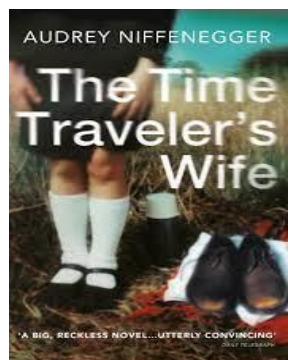
Genre: Science Fiction, Romance.
